NRA Whittington Center Funding Available

Each year our club awards the George Taylor IV Grant to provide financial assistance to youths to attend the two-week Adventure Camp program at the NRA Whittington Center in Raton, New Mexico. The 2026 camp will offer two sessions, one from June 14 to June 26, and the second from June 28 to July 10. Our club has reserved two positions in the second session for grant applicants.



The sponsorship is open to youths who will be aged 13 by the first day of their session and not turn 18 on or before the final day. Applicants must have a parent, grandparent, or legal guardian who is a member of the club, participate in a club sanctioned youth program, or be a member of the Mt. Lebanon High School Rifle Team. The grant provides \$650 toward the \$1,300 camp registration and reimburses a portion of your travel expenses.

During the program, participants learn from highly trained NRA Whittington Adventure instructors who teach the fundamentals of pistol, rifle, muzzleloading, and shotgun shooting skills with safety always foremost in mind. Campers are introduced to competitive shooting, rifle and pistol silhouette, and bullseye disciplines, plus skeet and trap shooting skills. Each camper will fire more than 1,200 rounds of ammunition during their stay.

#CMP Jr. Rifle Program

The Dormont-Mt. Lebanon Sportsmen's Club Jr. Rifle Program is currently scheduled to resume on Tuesday, September 23, 2025. Class starts at 7pm and runs until approximately 9pm each Tuesday, beginning on September 23 and running for 7 consecutive Tuesdays. The program consists of a 7-week instructional program emphasizing safety and marksmanship basics for new shooters.

**We will also be providing more advanced instruction for 3-position shooting to better prepare already experienced shooters for collegiate level competition.

Following the 7-week instructional program, additional practice and coaching are available every Tuesday at 7pm through the end of March.

- Focus of the program is juniors, suggested minimum age of 12
- Adult shooters may participate as well, class size permitting
- Rifles are .22 caliber target rifles which are sized for youth through adult
- You DO NOT need to be a member of the Dormont-Mt. Lebanon Sportsmen's Club to participate
- NRA Certified instructors lead the program
- Charge of \$20.00 total for the entire instructional program includes instruction book, ammo, targets, rifles and all needed equipment
- After the 7-week instructional program, all students who have previously completed the instructional program may return to shoot and work on their qualifications in the 4 positions. Rifles and all the necessary equipment are provided. There is a weekly charge for the open shooting, cost \$5.00 per week.

The program is a Veteran related subject; *Gold Star Wives of America, Inc.* It is being presented by Chrstine Stimmer Chojnicki aka Chris. Chris has been a member of Gold Star Wives of America, Inc. for 22 years. Her husband Army Sgt Les J. Chojnicki died in 2003 at the VA Nursing home.

Chris is an ardent advocate for Gold Star families and veterans. She has walked the halls of Congress to meet with lawmakers and brief them on Gold Star Family and veteran needs. She has participated in annual POW/MIA vigils, regional parades, and Veterans Leadership Stand Downs.

Firearm Tidd Bitts

Paul Ceriaui shot a 292 3X / 300 with a K31 Swiss straight pull in a CMP match on August 23 at the Reade Range. His slow prone was a 97 and his rapid was 92. In the slow fire offhand string he shot a 93 3X. That is a great score especially in offhand / standing setting him up for the Shuster Cup nomination for 2025 in an Antique Rifle match. Congrats Paul!

The shot gun is a great defensive weapon. Still used in close quarter fighting in VN. I had a discussion recently with Dave Bates about which buck shot load is the most effective. In my opinion #4 Buck is the most effective. Dave and others like #2 Buck. Just to give you a perspective #4 Buck has around 27 pellets ranging around 20 - 21 grains each. While #2 Buck has around 14 pellets around 30 – 31 grains each. I hunted deer with #4 Buck in NJ. It was extremely effective at 20-40 yards. **IMHO #4 Buck keeps a tighter group with more projectiles which is why it is so effective.** Ray English, club member, has new in box Remington short barrel tactical Model 870 in 12 gauge with a black oxide finish for sale. It is a devastating weapon. If interested contact him at 724-942-7295.

I read an article in G&A about the CZ 75 & 75 B SA pistol. This is the 50th anniversary of the CZ 75. I have never owned a CZ firearm. However, a member and friend really liked that pistol and used it for his work. He was a security manager for a corporation, but he also shot it competitively. That is a high recommendation. It looks like and is a close design to the Browning Model 35 HP. **The article said this which I thought was extremely interesting and a compliment "The Browning HP is the muscle car with bucket seats. The CZ 75 is a vehicle a Recaro seat that fits you complete with a racing harness. When you sit down, you know you're going to get some speed on."** The HP is the Browning Model 35, and this is it's 90th anniversary. **Just MHO quality, accuracy, is more important than quantity.** Either way the CZ 75 is a great option. A corporate security personnel reference is a significant compliment. Check it out!

Hunting

Well, we are into archery season! I read an interesting article in Outdoor News about using a single blade broad head. Then only using edging / sharpening one side of each side of an edge and the doing the same to the opposite edge to correspond / enhance the rotation of the arrow. **All designed to improve rotating speed and enhance penetration.** Sounds like a good design but I prefer the expandable. However, I really like the physics and science aspect in the above approach.

I hear a lot of bluster about archery hunters with compound and cross bows taking all the big bucks before opening day of rifle season. That is all nonsense! Those bucks taken in archery season didn't get that way in one year. Those bucks eluded the rifle hunters in the previous years. Rifle / deer season isn't like it was in the 60s-80s. There is not the huge population of hunters that would typically push bucks around on the first two days. Even then a novice and unskilled hunter had the potential of seeing and killing bucks at the beginning of the season. The deer herd now incorporates more mature bucks due to antler regulations and the lower population of hunters. However, killing a buck in rifle season requires more work and skill in scouting. Every day of the season is the same as you don't have all that large mixed group tramping through the woods. Patience, scouting and skill will provide success and with bigger and better racked buck. Just look at the recent history of bucks with great racks and breaking records.

Additionally, there is no logic for vertical bow hunters to criticize crossbow hunters. Vertical compounds have so many gadgets with sights and trigger release mechanisms there is very little difference between the archery technologies. What a crossbow does provide is more opportunity for senior hunters which has increased the archery hunter population. Killing a nice buck is better now than has been in our previous history. Also, all that opener nonsense on Saturday verses Monday is again nonsense due to the reduced hunter population. Our hunting culture has changed! Get off the bar stool and spend more time in the woods both before the season and during the season. JMHO!

There is a new trend in hunting out West in Utah. **They now have an elk season that requires open / iron sights to hunt.** No scope! Levels the playing field and requires more skill by elk hunters. It is a great change in the sport.

Sunday hunting, I have never really had a dramatic thought either way. I don't think it is a good cultural shift. We have moved away from our religious culture from our historical Blue Laws in our state. Sunday hunting places more pressure on the Game Warden staff and their families / lifestyle. The PGC needs to acknowledge and adjust to that impact! Again JMHO!

Fishing

September starts the change in temperature which eventually incorporates the lowering of water temperature in our streams and other water bodies. The significant adjustment is when **water temperature drops to levels from 60-55 degrees F.** This initiates the spawning of Brown trout and Steelhead migration in Lake Erie tributaries.

There is also the option for **Salmon fishing for Kings aka Chinook** which are the largest of the native Pacific species. In NY Lake Ontario tributaries / lake has been stocked with this salmon. **Fishing for Kings / Chinook is the ultimate sport fishery for trout / salmon species.** Access is 4-5 hours away North and an easy drive. Again it is temperature driven but typically early October is the best time. Check it out!

The creek on our club has been improving on water quality. Essentially related to natural changes that have provide settling and storage form flashing conditions on our property. The result has been a new caddis population. Some members thought these were mosquitos. **That is a very positive environmental change.** Also, the recent work on removing the old gas piping was reported in my August edition by Bill Fertall and others is very positive.

I found an article in Pa Outdoor News September to be very interesting for our state and trout fly fishing. Joe Humphrey is an historical legend in the sport and is connected to Penn State University. Legislative Issues

In Congress there is a Senate Bill S802. It is related to the Coast Guard (CG) and some parity issues that are not consistent with our other military branches. The CG has been used recently overseas in some stressful operations. I just read some history in a book "The Rifle 2" see below, that the CG was used on D Day in 1944. I was not aware of that until reading the book refenced above and below. I'm seeking support of a State House resolution to support S802. Please try to help?

There is a Senate Bill in the state, SB 857, by Senator Hutchinson R Clarion, Erie, Forest, Venango, Warren Counties – Counties. There was a previous House initiative by a Rep from Indiana County. A very slanted goal of these politicians is supporting developers. If you would listen to them and their staff rhetoric you would think the PGC has game lands over 50% of the state. Best recollection, it is around 5-6%. So, if you think the politicians are objective in their thinking, they are not. They are simply motivated by \$ financial support. Absolutely a subjective motivation behind these political initiatives!

Recommended Books to Read

I have read recently two books about our WW2 Veterans. I highly recommend that you read them. The two books are "The Rifle 1" and "The Rifle 2". The books author is Andrew Biggio, a Marine Veteran of Iraq / Afghanistan from Boston. Each Veteran's history is connected by their signature on a rifle and a chapter in the book. The book title is a reference to the M1 rifle; the *magnificent one*, M1.

The books places into historical the perspective that Veteran's generations commitment to the security and wellbeing of our country. That mind set and contribution, I feel, has been lost today within our current culture. Our relationship with allies seems to have been diluted into an independent isolationist perspective. We only survived back then via our relationship / alignment with our allies. Allies that had and still have a respect of values and a culture that mirrors American principles. Values that go right back to the beginning of our country via those documents that connect directly to our religious principles. We have lost that religious connection.

This WW2 generation of Veterans are now in their mid to late 90s. They will soon be gone. The war from that era had **multiple fronts across Europe**, **North Africa**, **Asia and the Pacific.** When you read the stories / history of these Veterans you can't help but be humbled by their history.

It is so enlightening to hear their history directly from their mouths. Each chapter is devoted to that Veteran's specific history. I'm a history fanatic and have read a significant number of books on WW2 but what I read in these books have stories that had details that rocked me back into a greater respect on their contributions. IMHO our country has lost their insight and appreciation of being an American. These Veteran's will all soon reach a100 if they can survive. Let us not forget them, their history and their insight.

Conclusion


There is way too much political tension in our country. We all need to step to the middle and avoid revenge in any form. Work as a team to resolve our problems at both home and abroad.

AMERICA'S RIFLE CHALLENGE (ARC)

ARC can be summarized by three words: **Exciting – Challenging – Fun!** So, what is it really?

Exciting: ARC is an action rifle & pistol program based upon defensive shooting skills using modern day firearms. Having a competition like format, events span entry level thru advanced, youth to adults, male and female. Stages incorporate the four basic shooting positions, multiple targets (paper, steel, and motion), barricade use, and multiple reloads.

Challenging: Events go beyond the typical target practice. The program is designed under NRA guidelines to ensure a safe yet challenging experience.

Clinics: entry level stages under the direction of NRA Certified Instructors and Range Safety Officers. Advanced Rifle: more rounds, more skills, more action. ARC Plus: The "plus" adds a pistol to the challenge and don't forget — we added a PCC category at the Pistoleer matches. Events incorporate the same skill sets and stages but involve matches using only the pistol or a pistol along with the rifle (2-Gun). We also will be bringing back the 22LR Special in October.

Fun: this program has a ton! Sending rounds down range is great, but ARC takes it to a whole new level!

Each month starting with February, the monthly online newsletter will have more detailed info regarding any upcoming events. By looking in the online newsletter section from 2024, you will get a better feel for what the program entails as well as noting the increasing number of individuals who have already caught on to the American Rifle Challenge!

ARC Plus – 22LR SPECIAL MATCH

What is this all about and why is it Special??

Good questions deserve good answers: <u>Special</u> – a multitiered ARC event, conducted during the same match; <u>22LR</u> – the only caliber allowed. *There must be prior participation in a Pistoleer, Advanced, or 2-Gun event.* You then can sign up for the same event, only this time the entire match will be conducted using 22LR firearms. The same action shooting, same targets, same barricades, same reloading – only change – the fun of using a 22LR firearm.

Date: Saturday, October 4, 2025 **Time:** 8 AM **Cost:** \$5 for DMLSC members; \$10 for non-members. **Pre-requisite: Must have** prior participation in the Pistoleer, Advanced, or 2-Gun.

22LR Firearms:

<u>Pistol:</u> any magazine fed semi-auto 22LR pistol.

Rifle: any magazine fed semi-auto 22LR rifle to include conversion AR's.

Sights: iron, red dot, laser, scope

22LR Special Match Course of Fire and Important Information

- Participants must have prior experience in the same event.
- All NRA Safety Rules and DMLSC Rules apply.
- Competitors need to attend a mandatory safety briefing.
- Keep all firearms cased and in your vehicles until instructed to bring them to the lower ranges.
- Eye/Ear Protection is mandatory.
- Pistols must be carried in an external holster and rifles must be carried on a sling.
- Participants must have a minimum of two (2) magazines per firearm (3 is optimal).
- 22LR only no magnums.
- No suppressors shot timers have a hard time to pick up the noise.

Note: After signing up for the match, a full detailed description will be sent along with other important information. An example of one stage is provided below.

Stage 5: (10+ yds.) Knock Over Steel Plate Drill

RO & PO – Two 5-round magazines

2G (pistol first) - One 5-round rifle magazine, one 5-round pistol magazine

When time begins, attempt to knock over <u>8 targets.</u> When empty, **RELOAD/TRANSITION TO RIFLE** – there are two additional rounds to accomplish this.


