Plinking Range Rules

PLINKING RANGE RULES

- 1. This range was created for the fun of simply shooting and is intended for the complete un-organized enjoyment of the membership. The only restrictions apply to safety. As it is permissible to shoot at various distances from the targets, care must be exercised with multiple group usage. When multiple groups are using the range concurrently, all shooters will meet to review safe gun handling rules and to designate the location of a common firing line. In all cases if one group is firing in front of the bench, others present are not permitted to touch or handle any firearms. As a courtesy to all members, do not monopolize the range and have consideration for those that also wish to use the range. In all cases, use common sense, be courteous, and consider the safety of others.
- 2. Only pistols, shotguns, .22 caliber rim-fire rifles and center fire rifles that are chambered for a straight wall pistol cartridge may be used on this range. Rifles that are chambered for any bottleneck center-fire cartridge or .17 caliber cartridge are prohibited.
- **3.** Informal targets such as metal cans and plastic jugs are allowed, and <u>WATER</u> is the only liquid permitted to be used in these targets. **ABSOLUTELY NO PAINT CANS!**Remember to consider ricochet when positioning targets. Control your elevation the trees are not a backstop and may not be used for target support!
- 4. An object containing any amount of glass is prohibited.
- 5. Clean up after yourself! If you brought it in, you take it out! Spent Shotgun Hulls must be collected and hauled out!
- **6.** Even under control, the practice of emptying magazines at the highest possible rate is still an **unsafe** practice!

Please review these rules and ALL Safety Rules before visiting the club!

If you know of a young adult that would like to learn 4 position small bore shooting this would be a great time to have them come and ask our team and young adults about the class that starts in September.



It is a photography chronicle memoir and haunting documentation of the nuclear reactor disaster site in Ukraine. The now abandoned city of Pripyat. Also, a visit with psychiatric institution and orphanage and untold interviews with the last remaining survivors and inhabitants. Mike has enlightened audiences nationwide with a rare

Fishing

Our club stream is stocked with trout by the Fish Commission with locals and members enjoying the season. The weather has been cold, rainy and miserable but spring is here. If you are an avid pursuer of trout with flies, you might want to visit the Dark Skies web page. It includes a magazine, fishing insight, guide service, and fly fishing materials including leaders and the obvious, flies. It is managed by a Pennsylvania resident from Potter County who is an avid trout fishing addict and deer hunter. Check it out!

The current craze is Euro fishing which is high sticking with a long leader. Not my style or cup of tea but nevertheless an effective fishing tactic. There is also a local custom fly rod fabricator. I just ordered a new rod from him. His name is Rich Steinhart and his shop goes by Mr. Ant's Rods. Best means of contacting him is via text at 724-272-5903 or email at mrantsrods@comcast.net. John Mahn our local Fish and Boat Commissioner has applied for membership in our club. John is an obvious fishing addict but very laid back and a peach of a person. John is from Carmichael and has an interest in shooting sports beyond his passion for fishing. https://search.app/T1msKTptxuFkoYr16

Fishing with Eagles and Ospreys – This is a story about eagles and ospreys that came to mind after an email exchange with Bob Popso about some videos. Both stories are from fishing in and along the Madison River and an adjacent lake, Cliff. Typically, both glide in at a flat angle and grab the fish that is near the surface. However, I was at 3\$ Bridge on the Madison and at about 30 yards away an osprey shocked me, as it went vertical with a splash. It emerged empty handed but that was a first for me; going vertical below the surface.

The other is about an experience with an eagle fishing on Cliff Lake about 3-5 miles from the Madison in a narrow cove. We saw the eagle as it expressed displeasure with our presence. The lake is full of bows (short for rainbow trout). An eagle came in real close, again 30-40 yards at a flat angle about 5' off the surface. Then it came to a stop and then immediately did a 180 degree turn. Then it dropped immediately to the surface and plucked a bow and flew off to the shore high up in a conifer with its catch. Then proceeded to shriek etc. which I assume; it was mocking us.

That's one of the many benefits of fishing. Especially my style as I prefer to be alone / slow and don't rush to the water or to leave it. I also don't move very far say 20-40 yards. Trout are everywhere especially on the Madison. My sons are just the opposite, rush to the water, move constantly. If you take your time to observe you get those great opportunities to see the life within the water / hatches and wildlife; minks, ducks, swallows, eagles, hawks and numerous others. That is the beauty of the sport. I hunt deer the same way. Usually from a stand all day or a very slow still hunt. You get the opportunity to relax and observe and take it all in. It also gives you that quiet time to meditate and solve yours and the worlds problems. Try it!

Hunting / Shotgun Pattern Target System

We have established a target system for use on the Plinking range to pattern shotguns. Innovation and creativity by Kirk Marker with just a little verbal input. Our Executive Range Officer, Bruce Ungar has established parameters and rules of use. The system will be set in place the last two weeks in April for hunter prep for turkey hunting. Others who use the Plinking Range during this period are not allowed to use the target system in any form for their Plinking Range shooting. Rules to be posted and violators will be punished. The system will be set in place periodically throughout the year for those who shoot trap and other shotgun sports / hunting.

Guns & Ammo – I receive and read a long list of periodicals. **G&A** is currently the best one that reflects my shooting interests at the club. I have circulated the magazine to other members. Current editions which have been covering a Series on Sniper Rifles from WW2. The first was Mausers. The May edition covers the Mosin - Nagant 91/30 PU, 7.62x54R. June will cover the Springfield 1903A4 rifle. Very well done, good read! Looking forward to the June issue on the 03A4.

There appears to be a new rifle craze recognizable in G&A via articles / commercials in straight wall cartridge with lever action rifles. Now even with 223R in lever action with the Henry Supreme. Smith & Wesson has been marketing the new model, Model 1854, for the straight walls which include 357 Mag, 44 Mag and 45 Colt. Certainly, gives credence to the European previous versions of lever action rifles which were replications of the earlier Winchester rifles. These new models are more modern versions rather than replication of the older rifles. Easy to reload for and to shoot. Provides more options for rifle selection in the outdoor silhouette Summer matches at the club. Also, a reasonable deer cartridge at close range.

Another G&A article I found to be very insightful was on new carbon fiber and ceramic rifle barrels. This design uses new technology to provide for thermal inertia to provide a cooler and more accurate rifle.

My sister-in-law gave me a periodical Hadassah to read as it had an article "Armed and Ready" about firearms personal protection from a spin from the Hamas attack in October last year. Surprisingly written from California where there has been a dramatic increase in purchasing firearms and training in the use.

The Jewish community culture now has new series of clubs called Bullets & Bagels. A very appropriate cultural change in these community sects in California. A controversial state that now has a growing movement in shooting clubs and 2A for personal protection.

I have a new gunsmith that I like that I can attribute to Tom Benedict, **Fayette Gun Shop. The gunsmith is Vincent Capan.** Tom's input was tied to some great work that Vince did on a trigger on a Smith revolver for Tom. This is a super find and I have had him do several projects for me. However, the skill of note is his ability to fine tune triggers. He is a very busy gunsmith. **He is in Fairchance 15436 on 68 East Church Street. His phone number is 724-564-7720.** Thank you, Tom!

In the May / Ted's Thoughts I will continue with the reloading training. If interested in this training program you should have focused and have bought a reloading manual. Then at this point you have studied and read extensively the manual instructions on reloading. You should have also at this point investigated several options for manufactures of presses and reloading equipment. I would recommend RCBS, Redding or Dillon. I do not recommend Hornady presses or dies. They make great bullets, but I don't like their presses / dies.



AMERICA'S RIFLE CHALLENGE (ARC)

ARC can be summarized by three words: **Exciting – Challenging – Fun!** So, what is it really?

Exciting: ARC is an action rifle & pistol program based upon defensive shooting skills using modern day firearms. Having a competition like format, events span entry level thru advanced, youth to adults, male and female. Stages incorporate the four basic shooting positions, multiple targets (paper, steel, and motion), barricade use, and multiple reloads.

Challenging: Events go beyond the typical target practice. The program is designed under NRA guidelines to ensure a safe yet challenging experience.

Clinics: entry level stages under the direction of NRA Certified Instructors and Range Safety Officers. Advanced Rifle: more rounds, more skills, more action. ARC Plus: The "plus" adds a pistol to the challenge and don't forget — we added a PCC category at the Pistoleer matches. Events incorporate the same skill sets and stages but involve matches using only the pistol or a pistol along with the rifle (2-Gun). We also will be bringing back the 22LR Special in October.

Fun: this program has a ton! Sending rounds down range is great, but ARC takes it to a whole new level!

Each month starting with February, the monthly online newsletter will have more detailed info regarding any upcoming events. By looking in the online newsletter section from 2024, you will get a better feel for what the program entails as well as noting the increasing number of individuals who have already caught on to the American Rifle Challenge!

ARC Combined AR Rifle Clinic & Basic Match

Dormont-Mt. Lebanon Sportsmen's Club is sponsoring a **Combined AR Rifle Clinic & Basic Match** in conjunction with the America's Rifle Challenge (ARC) Program. This event is designed for shooters of all ages (14+) and <u>will be geared toward those with little or no experience using the AR Rifle Platform.</u>

NRA Certified Instructors and RSO's will provide instruction on safe gun handling, introduction to action rifle skills, dry fire practice, and several stages of live fire. This event will progress at a slow enough pace for participants to gain an introduction to action rifle match protocol and develop a comfortable level of operation with the AR Rifle. <u>Successful completion of this event will qualify all for Advanced Matches scheduled for later in the year.</u>

<u>NOTE:</u> This event is <u>more robust</u> than either past Clinics or Basic Matches. The entire event will be conducted outside on the Marsico Range and will occur rain or shine!

Date: Saturday May 10, 2025 **Time:** 8:00 to 12:00

Cost: \$5 for DMLSC members; \$10 for non-members.

<u>Live Fire Portion: 60 rounds total</u> <u>The Course of Fire will be supplied upon registration.</u>

Rifle Categories:

Iron Sights: a rifle that has only iron sights

<u>Optics Limited</u>: a rifle that has only a non-magnified optic, such as ACOG, EoTech, Red Dot, etc. Back up iron sights are allowed.

Optics Open: a maximum of two optic sights with a maximum of one being magnified.

- All NRA Safety Rules and DMLSC Rules apply. NOTE: **do not use 5.56 ammunition in a rifle that is chambered only for the .223 caliber.**
- Eye/Ear Protection and Empty Chamber Indicators are mandatory (ECI's are available for a \$1 charge).
- Rifles need to be Zeroed for 100 yards **prior** to the match. No spotting scopes or shooting jackets. Shooting mats are allowed.
 - Rifles should have attached slings capable of being worn across the back (but not mandatory).
- Competitors should have a minimum of 3 magazines and need to carry them on the person using a bandoleer, pouch, pocket, or similar device. Bring additional ammunition above the required number of rounds.
- No incendiary ammunition. <u>All stages utilizing steel targets</u> Lead core ammunition only, no armor piercing (AP), no solid or partial core ammunition containing steel or any metal other than lead.

<u>Space is limited to 20 shooting positions.</u> To ensure your participation, contact John T. via email: <u>dmlscNRA@outlook.com</u>

<u>Pre-registration is required and will be open starting April 1, 2025</u>

ARC - Advanced Rifle Match

As part of the America's Rifle Challenge Program, DMSC will conduct an Advanced Rifle Match in 2024. Intended for experienced action rifle shooters, competitors will be required to change firing positions, move through multiple firing points and reload <u>against the clock.</u> Squading assignments will be made comprising of 5 shooters.

Date: Saturday, June 14, 2025. **Pre-requisites:** Previous participation in a DMSC Basic/Clinic Match or other experience as determined by the match director. **Time:** 7 AM – 12 PM **Cost:** \$5 for DMLSC members; \$10 for non-members.

Advanced Match Course of Fire: 64 rounds total

** This is a magazine retention stage** When time begins, while standing about 5 feet away from the barricade fire two rounds to both the left and right targets. With magazine removed and retained, advance to behind the barricade and reload. Using one of the portals, fire two rounds to both the left and right targets, reload and retain the magazine, then fire two rounds to both the left and right targets, using a different portal.

** Note: The above stage details only one of the six stages in the Course of Fire. After signing up for the match, a full detailed description of all six stages will be sent along with other important information. **

Rifle Categories:

Iron Sights: a rifle that has only iron sights

<u>Optics Limited</u>: a rifle that has only a non-magnified optic, such as ACOG, EoTech, Red Dot, etc. Back up iron sights are allowed.

Optics Open: a maximum of two optic sights with a maximum of one being magnified.

- Participants need to have prior experience in an action rifle match, such as the DMSC's Basic/Clinic ARC Match or other experience as determined by the match director.
- All NRA Safety Rules and DMLSC Rules apply.
- Competitors need to attend a mandatory safety briefing and will assist in set up and tear down.
- Keep all rifles cased and in your vehicles until instructed to bring them to the firing line.
- Eye/Ear Protection and Empty Chamber Indicators are mandatory (ECI's are available for a \$1 charge).
- Rifles need to be Zeroed for 100 yards **prior** to the match. No spotting scopes, **shooting mats**, or shooting jackets are permitted.
- Rifles need to have attached slings capable of being worn across the back.
- Competitors should have a minimum of 3 magazines (5 magazines are optimal) and will need to carry them in a bandoleer, pouch, pocket, or similar device on the person for each stage.
- No incendiary ammunition. All stages utilizing steel targets <u>Lead core ammunition only</u>, no armor piercing (AP), no solid or partial core ammunition containing steel or any metal other than lead.


