## **# NRA Whittington Center**

# "The George Taylor IV Grant"

NRA Whittington Center Funding Available

Each year our club awards the George Taylor IV Grant to provide financial assistance to youths to attend the two-week Adventure Camp program at the NRA Whittington Center in Raton, New Mexico. The 2025 camp will offer two sessions, one from June 8 to June 20, and the other from June 22 to July 4. Our club has reserved three positions in the second session for grant applicants.



The sponsorship is open to youths who will be aged 13 by the first day of their session and not turn 18 on or before the final day. Applicants must have a parent, grandparent, or legal guardian who is a member of the club or be a member of the Mt. Lebanon High School Rifle Team. The grant provides \$650 toward the \$1,300 camp registration and reimburses up to \$300 in travel expenses.

During the program, participants learn from highly trained NRA Whittington Adventure instructors who teach the fundamentals of pistol, rifle, muzzleloading, and shotgun shooting skills with safety always foremost in mind. Students are introduced to competitive shooting, rifle and pistol silhouette, and bullseye disciplines, plus skeet and trap shooting skills. Each student gets to fire more than 1,200 rounds of ammunition during their stay.

To be considered for the grant, please complete the grant application that follows this information and return it, along with a 200-word essay on how you will benefit from attending the camp, and a list of your extracurricular activities and shooting experience by **Dec. 31, 2024**.

#### **Firearm News Tidbits**

I was in Ace Sporting Goods just before Thanksgiving. They had a ton of new stock in used Colt and S&W pistols. Some of the S&W were Semi Auto but there was a significant number of Revolvers by both Smith and Colt. These are the two best historical pistol manufactures; MHO.

I was in Ace to help a neighbor's wife pick out a revolver for self defense. She has a nice new Smith SA 380 but she has trouble working the slide and magazine. So, I steered her to a revolver. In doing so I discovered something significant about Colt revolvers. I have an Anaconda in 357 Mag / 38 Spl which I trained her on. **The Colt's double action triggers are significantly smoother with lower level of tension. A significantly better trigger than a comparable Smith**. There is a lot to be said for a revolver with those attributes being used for self defense

The Colt snake guns are now back in production. These original Python, Viper, Anaconda, and King Cobra revolvers are now also available in 22 LR; besides the popular center fire 38 and 44 caliber cartridges that made them famous. There is a lot of good derived from the new production of these older historical style pistols. It is a great revival!

There is also a ton of respect for 1911 SA by both Smith and Colt. The original single action 1911 SA by Browning is still the best defensive pistol, MHO; same logic in target shooting. John Moses Browning was a genius. I **think I have heard that before!** His Model 35 or Hi Power is my favorite pistol. First double stacked magazine. All from the period of the early 1900s! The pistols of



today are just replications of Browning's 1911s with just some different bells and whistles; if you are into those sounds, so be it. Refinement yes! Significantly better, no not really. MHO!

Another significant piece of news info is the current CMP auction on the M1D rifles. The M1D is the scoped sniper version of the M1. As a member of our club you can make purchases from the CMP. You will need proof of membership. Please text Ell Vines 412-721-9632 or send note with dues to get a special signed membership card. M1D scopes and parts are also available in the auction. Check the CMP web page. It is an excellent reference.

#### **Ammo Tidbits**

In pistol ammo for self defense and target shooting it is hard to find a better cartridge than the 45 ACP (Automatic Colt Pistol). My old friend, passed recently, Bill Phillips, with his wry sense of humor, called it the Little Fat Boy. Obviously, this all ties back to Browning in his 1911 45 ACP pistol cartridge. Again, from the early 1900s! Still considered by some of our military special programs as the ultimate defensive close quarter defensive round. It was used in WW2 in two sub machine guns / close quarter automatic weapons, the Thompson and the M3; aka grease gun. Still used by our military in Vietnam late in the 60s-70s.



See the attached pic of the 45 ACP. On the left is a 230 grain FMJ (Full Metal Jacket) or **Hard Ball** as my buddy Dave Faust used to call it. It is designed with a muzzle velocity of 900 fps. This is a defensive round. Either way it is a devastating projectile. On the right is a target round or Semi Wad Cutter 200 grain bullet. So, you can visualize Bill Phillips connotation of the Little Fat Boy. As a defensive round it is a hard pill for your enemy to absorb. Even if the hit is in an arm or leg it typically takes your enemy out of the fight. Nice to know! That's why every Marine in VN 67 was scrambling for the 1911 or an M3. At least you could defend yourself as you wait for McNamara in 1967 to get us a rifle that functioned. He should have never taken our M14s in the manner he did,

#### never!!

That wad cutter (R) should have been seated deeper; it is my hand load.

Another popular round today is the 9mm. Typically a 115 grain bullet at 1,100 fps hence increasing energy via velocity. Interesting comparison for a future discussion. I'm fond of old theories; maybe that's because I'm 80. Sounds logical to me!

## **Hunting Tidbits**



In archery season I had a run in with ticks. Passed one on to my lovely wife Jacque. It decided to set up camp just outside her ear canal. It took me few seconds to see the cause of her pain. I could not get that bugger to back off with alcohol or extract via tweezers. We ended up in ER. The doc removed it with a tool he bought online via Amazon. See attached pic of the packet that has three sizes. Cost was \$11 so I bought several kits for family. Quite an unusual stocking stuffer – miracles of modern medical science!! If you are trying to pick up a crawling tick just use a small section of scotch tape. Cover and stick them, then fold the tape and toss. I keep a roll in the truck. Ticks are a real pain when ground hog / deer hunting.

My CMP / Camp Perry shooting partner had a noteworthy successful hunt. A buck was shot at 250 yards with a 308. It struck and split heart, that is a significant hunt and shot. I have killed my fair share of bucks in several states but never had a shot for a white tail at that distance, not even close thereto. Congrats Bruce Long!

#### **Range Issues and Notations**

We maintain a locker that is set at the bunker edge between Marsico and the Bench Rest Range (BRR). It is for storage of benching devices and bags for benching rifles. I donated 3 sniper bags like we use at Camp Perry Nationals for bench shooting and training for the Sniper Match. Two bags were just recently replaced due to an inadvertent problem with the shooter not extending the muzzle beyond the bag and damaging it. Some members again failed to properly extend the muzzle beyond the bag causing another occurrence. Whoever is responsible please apologize and arrange to replace the bags. The expense is not that significant but the time and energy to fill a bag with wood chips or plastic beads is significant.

There is a problem with short barrel rifle or carbine / pistol bottle neck firearms not being used on the appropriate range. The above-mentioned Upper, Marsico and BRR, ranges are the only ranges on the club where these special firearms can

be shot. Members / guests need to be cognizant of your muzzle when shooting. If not positioned properly the muzzle discharge causes damage. The erroneous use of these firearms has also been occurring at the Lower Meadow Range and Plinking Range. Please note new signage!

Winter Indoor Range access is available on Wednesday PM, Saturday AM / PM and Sunday PM. Please note the timeline reference on the calendar. Jacketed and Lead CF pistol cartridges and 22 RF Rifles and pistols are permitted firearms on this indoor range.

A special note of appreciation to **Jeff Kelley and Jack Ramsay** for the nice maintenance and upkeep of the target systems etc. and other facilities at the Lower Meadow Range. Also, special recognition and appreciation to **Ken Helfer, Karen McNary and Bill Fertall** for the painting and maintenance of the club

## Veteran Info

Please consider contacting Guy Reschenthaler / Congressional House Rep and Congressional Senators John Fetterman and incoming Senator Bill McCormick to address Coast Guard parity pay issues in 2025. The Coast Guard is currently under the Department of Homeland Security. **Despite their duties in the Pacific, Atlantic and the other world water courses beyond our waters in defense of our country, they do not have the same pay parity as the other military branches.** That is a problem! Previous legislation under HR2693 (2023) was designed to address that parity problem. Considering the service history of Reschenthaler and McCormick our great state may be able to stimulate new legislation on this parity problem.

**Please consider joining the Veterans Breakfast Club (VBC).** It is an outstanding Veterans organization. I observed a recent Zoom meeting of the VBC with Le Ly

Hayslip. Her memoir / book "When Heaven and Earth Changed Places. #### **DMSC Conducts Safety Reviews**

Range Safety Officers (RSOs) will conduct random membership checks and safety reviews. RSOs will meet with members and guests while at the firing range. Membership ID's will be checked, and a copy of the range rules will be made available. It is important for all members to review safe gun handling procedures and to focus on the safety rules for each range used. The RSOs will be a wearing a distinctive safety vest or hat and will only ask for a few minutes of your time. Guests and Visitors are subject to the same rules as members. Violators will be subject to disciplinary action up to and including dismissal from club grounds and termination of membership.
