Range Operations


Please maintain your "A Game" (attitude) while on the range. Muzzle control must be in your DNA. Please go Clear when requested and use an ECI.

DMLSC - February Hosting HS SB Prone Rifle Competition

On the 2nd and 3rd weeks in February we will be hosting again the Small Bore (SB) Prone HS Rifle Competition. On the first week it is the WPIAL regional competition with team competition on Tuesday the 11th and then the individual competition on the 13th. The club awards annually the Taylor – Eddy Trophy to the top competitor. The trophy honors the late Earl Taylor and Mike Eddy. Both had distinguished HS careers in shooting and in the military. Also, former officers in our club and great historical mentors to the HS shooting sports. Last year 2024 Carlee Valenta, on left, from Penn Hills was the trophy winner. Carlee's sister will probably be in the mix this year. In 2023 and 2022 Riley Dunn, on right, from McGuffey HS was the trophy winner. Riley is in Nebraska competing with the

Cornhuskers at the collegiate level. Brook Fanala, middle, from Hempfield was in 2nd place. Carlee and Brook were tied except for the center cuts (perfect concentric X). Riley came in 3rd only by one X count. Riley is a familiar face at the club as she also won the trophy in 2022 & 2023. Her father, grandfather / Ken Helfer, and Uncle AJ Helfer are all members of our club.

The club hosts the shooters in the Membership Hall during the competition's multiple relays. There will



be school buses and limited parking. You may want to choose a different day to come to the range but your call.

On the 3rd week we will again be hosting matches. This week the top team and individuals in the state will be competing. The matches are hosted by region. So, on Tuesday the 18th there will be the team competition and, on the 20th, the individual competition. This week is not as busy as the previous but again buses everywhere and limited parking.

There is an "obvious" in looking at the pic. Girls excel in shooting among their bros. Women are more mature and more mentally focused which makes them great competitors in the shooting sports. The only sport where women excel above their male counterparts. So, parents / grandparents don't be shy about encouraging your daughter and granddaughters to compete in this sport.

Training – Reloading

To accommodate those who have expressed interests I have decided on the format described below. The focus will be on the 38 Special as it has multiple options for use in club competitions in both pistol and rifle at our club. It is a straight wall case and parent of the 357 Mag. Loading it is reasonably easy to reload and can then establish a foundation for your future in shooting in target shooting pistol and rifle. Loading a bottle neck rifle cartridge is significantly more involved but at least this will be a start.

Listed below is an outline that I will follow. The last two steps (108 & 109) will be at a training session in house with other expertise from the club. So, the training outline is as follows:

- 101 Buy / Read manual
- 102 Buy equipment and components
- 103 Cleaning Brass
- 104 Environmental Awareness and Attitude
- 105 Sizing
- 106 Flaring
- 107 Priming
- 108 Loading
- 109 Testing / Shooting

101 – Buy / Read Manual – Manuals are typically published by bullet manufactures such as Hornady, Speer, Sierra, Lyman and several others. You can buy new or buy a used book. The 38 Special has been around since 1902 so any typical used manual will work. Then read carefully the sections in the manual at least 2-3 times. Next look up in the manual the section devoted to the 38 Special. Read carefully this section and refer in the manuals to steps / chapters to the specific reloading steps in the manual or manuals. If you are not committed to doing this reading you are not ready to start reloading or continuing with this training program.

In the next month we will focus on equipment and components 102. However, you need to complete 101 - Buy / Read Manual before following in the training program. You may also want to seek out a friend and or associate that reloads and that is willing to help mentor you. Readily seek out discussion and ask questions! An association in our club is great as you have multiple personalities to seek out and explore your reloading interests.

Back Country Hunters Anglers (BHA) - Wilderness in an Uncertain Future

I'm a member of the BHA. Those who know me understand my focus on birds, trees and wildlife. I'm an avid hunter and fisherman. My grandfather has taught me an appreciation for trees / woods and wildlife. I'm a Conservationist.

There is a constant threat for private entities to control our public lands and stream for their own private interests in our nation and in our great state of Pennsylvania. There is considerable pressure in Utah, Montana, Idaho and several other Western states. However, there is the same pressure and concern locally and in our state. Typically, the wealthy and the political elements fall into this narrative. Trying to successfully generate income and private use of public streams and public lands. So it is that motivation to resist this element that led me to join BHA.

As of now, any ideas of facilitating more intentional management of Wilderness are just whispers, drowned out by both sides: calls to dispense with the concept entirely or to add more lands into this system of preservation. However, these conversations will rise, and hunters and anglers must remain at the forefront of these debates, just as we always have been.

"We have a responsibility to both protect these areas from incursions of modern humanity, while also adapting to changing conditions," McArthur added. "But any management decisions must be made with the utmost care and respect for the land. Wilderness areas are not places to impose humanity's will on the landscape—they are places to learn humility and to allow the world to shape us."

BHA member Charlie Booher is a conservation lobbyist at Watershed Results LLC and holds degrees in wildlife biology, public policy, and natural resource conflict resolution from Michigan State University and the University of Montana. Outside of the office, you can find him hiking the mountains of Western Montana and relearning how to hunt and fish in the Northern Rockies.

The note is one of thousands of documents



AMERICA'S RIFLE CHALLENGE (ARC)

ARC can be summarized by three words: **Exciting – Challenging – Fun!** So, what is it really?

Exciting: ARC is an action rifle & pistol program based upon defensive shooting skills using modern day firearms. Having a competition like format, events span entry level thru advanced, youth to adults, male and female. Stages incorporate the four basic shooting positions, multiple targets (paper, steel, and motion), barricade use, and multiple reloads.

Challenging: Events go beyond the typical target practice. The program is designed under NRA guidelines to ensure a safe yet challenging experience.

Clinics: entry level stages under the direction of NRA Certified Instructors and Range Safety Officers. Advanced Rifle: more rounds, more skills, more action. ARC Plus: The "plus" adds a pistol to the challenge and don't forget — we added a PCC category at the Pistoleer matches. Events incorporate the same skill sets and stages but involve matches using only the pistol or a pistol along with the rifle (2-Gun). We also will be bringing back the 22LR Special in October.

Fun: this program has a ton! Sending rounds down range is great, but ARC takes it to a whole new level!

Each month starting with February, the monthly online newsletter will have more detailed info regarding any upcoming events. By looking in the online newsletter section from 2024, you will get a better feel for what the program entails as well as noting the increasing number of individuals who have already caught on to the American Rifle Challenge!

ARC Plus – Pistoleer/PCC Match

As part of the America's Rifle Challenge Program, DMSC will conduct the first of two Pistoleer/PCC Matches. Pistoleer/PCC Match?? Just what is a Pistoleer/PCC Match? If you have been shooting down on the lower ranges, then you are a "Pistoleer" and this match may be something of interest to you. Participants will compete in several "pistol only" stages firing at paper, steel, and motion targets. This is an action pistol match and the course of fire entails modern day defensive shooting skills involving distances from 5 to 30 feet, multiple targets, barricades, several reloads, and a whole lot of fun.

*** A PCC is short for a Pistol Caliber Carbine and as such can also be used. ***

Date: Sunday, April 12, 2025 Time: 8 AM Cost: \$5 for DMLSC members; \$10 for non-members.

Pistoleer/PCC Course of Fire: Total rounds - 80

** Note: After signing up for the match, a full detailed description will be sent along with other important information. Below is an example of one of the seven stages. **

Stage 3: (7 yds.) Multiple Target Drill with Reload (Two 6-round magazines.)

** This is a magazine retention stage** When time begins, fire 2 shots to the left target's lower A-Zone and 1 shot to the left target's upper A-Zone and fire 2 shots to the right target's lower A-Zone and 1 shot to the right target's upper A-Zone, reload while retaining the magazine, then repeat the shot sequence.

Firearm Categories:

<u>Iron Sights:</u> a pistol or PCC that has only iron sights

Optics: a pistol or PCC that has only an optic, such as a Red Dot, laser, etc.

- While there are no pre-requisites, this match will not involve any instruction and participants should possess safe pistol handling skills.
- All NRA Safety Rules and DMLSC Rules apply.
- Competitors need to attend a mandatory safety briefing conducted at the clubhouse.
- Keep all pistols cased and in your vehicles until instructed to bring them to the lower ranges.
- Eye/Ear Protection is mandatory.
- Calibers from 9 mm through 45LC are allowed, but no magnums. <u>All pistols must be securely carried in an exterior holster and PCC's need to have a sling attached.</u>
- The match will be conducted as an individual utilizing a shot timer. Scoring will be a combination of speed and accuracy. All stages will begin from the low-ready position.
- Competitors should have a minimum of 3 magazines for the semi-automatic pistols/PCC, and will need to carry them on the person for each live fire stage.
- No incendiary ammunition. All stages utilizing steel targets <u>Lead core ammunition only</u>, no armor piercing (AP), no solid or partial core ammunition containing steel or any metal other than lead.

Space is limited to 24 shooting positions. Registration opens on March 1, 2025. To ensure your participation, contact John T. via email: dmlscNRA@outlook.com


