"The George Taylor IV Grant"

NRA Whittington Center Funding Available

Each year our club awards the George Taylor IV Grant to provide financial assistance to youths to attend the two-week Adventure Camp program at the NRA Whittington Center in Raton, New Mexico. The 2025 camp will offer two sessions, one from June 8 to June 20, and the other from June 22 to July 4. Our club has reserved three positions in the second session for grant applicants.



The sponsorship is open to youths who will be aged 13 by the first day of their session and not turn 18 on or before the final day. Applicants must have a parent, grandparent, or legal guardian who is a member of the club or be a member of the Mt. Lebanon High School Rifle Team. The grant provides \$650 toward the \$1,300 camp registration and reimburses up to \$300 in travel expenses.

During the program, participants learn from highly trained NRA Whittington Adventure instructors who teach the fundamentals of pistol, rifle, muzzleloading, and shotgun shooting skills with safety always foremost in mind. Students are introduced to competitive shooting, rifle and pistol silhouette, and bullseye disciplines, plus skeet and trap shooting skills. Each student gets to fire more than 1,200 rounds of ammunition during their stay.

To be considered for the grant, please complete the grant application that follows this information and return it, along with a 200-word essay on how you will benefit from attending the camp, and a list of your extracurricular activities and shooting experience by **Dec. 31, 2024**.

Physical Therapy in Shooting

Cartridge Comparison



I read an article recently about the comparison between the short action 223 Remington and the 308 Winchester / NATO. I decided to add in the venerable and historic .30-06. The 06 is obviously not a short action round. All three are military cartridges. The 30 06 is dramatically connected to the Garand and Springfield. The 308 NATO is connected to the M14 and the 223R to the AR. I added in a pic for a visual comparison. The .30-06 and the 308 NATO have similar ballistic performance and ranges. Except that the 06 can easily reach out to 1000 meters with a 200-grain projectile.

IMHO the 223R was a failure as a military round. It was originally designed for 300 meters. Subsequently redesigned as 5.56 NATO with faster twist rifling and heavier weight bullet. Recently the shooting community have added the 308 NATO round into Garand competitions. Some recent rifle configurations in the Garand now incorporate the 308 NATO. Interesting!

On the use for hunting, the 223R is my favorite varmint / ground hog cartridge out to 300 - 400 yards. The 308 NATO and 06 are essentially the same hunting cartridge. Unless of course if you want to use / load it with a 200 grain or similar heavier bullet. Obviously then you get more foot pounds of energy and capability at longer ranges. The .30-06 is well over 100 years old and is hard to beat as a hunting round. It can be loaded with 110 / 120 grain bullet as a Varmint and 200 grains for Brown / Grizzly Bears. Otherwise, 140 – 170 grain bullets are used.
