

### Death Wind aka Lewis Wetzel 1763 - 1808

If you read my May issue you would made the connection to Death Wind who was

a proficient rifle shooter. An attribute that kept you alive during our early American history 1600-1800. That connection I was making related to our history and genetics in SW Pennsylvania, Pittsburgh area. That history was dramatically projected in the book "The Dark and Bloody River" written by Allan W. Eckert. That river of reference is the Ohio River! So, the connection / attribute to marksmanship that

we have in our club, I was inferring that it was genetics; "the nut never falls too far from the tree". However, what is unique is that we have two cub members, Matt and Robert Wetzel, who are distant relative of Lewis Wetzel aka Death Wind.



## **Pistol Shooting Sports**

Just as I elaborated about our club's expertise in riflery, I want to do the same with pistol shooting. We have some outstanding pistol shooters at our club. Typically associated with match programs. The most significant, IMHO, is NRA Bullseye. The match is every Monday night at 6 PM outdoors and 7 pm indoors. It is shot at the Upper Pistol Range (UPR) during the warm months and indoors in the Indoor Range Building (IRB) in the cold months. Aside from "sighters" it is a 60 round match; 30 rounds rimfire and 30 rounds centerfire. Ten rounds slow fire in ten minutes! Ten rounds timed fire, two five round strings in 20 seconds each! Ten rounds rapid fire, two five round strings in 10 seconds each! NRA rules require that the shooter must shoot one handed. There are some others basic rules. Outdoors (UPR) the distance is slow fire at 50 yards and timed & rapid at 25 yards. Indoors (IRB) the distance is 50 feet. The targets are configured differently for the various distances. Please see the attached target recently shot by Gene Bedner in timed fire at 25 yards; perfect score and 9X. That is a long term "frid" or mancave posting! The match is managed by Bruce Ungar / Bruce Long with support.



We have a lot of pistol shooting expertise; Bruce Ungar, Chuck Augenstein, Jason Allshouse, Gene Bedner, Bruce Long, Dave Gannon and numerous others. One unique shooter is Dave Ullom. Dave holds more records in NRA Bullseye at our club. He just recently renewed his membership as he had retired previously as a snowbird to Florida but recently returned to Pennsylvania. We shoot in a league with several other clubs in the area.

We have a NRA Silhouette Match that we shoot on the fourth Saturday of each month during the warmer outdoor season. That match is shot on the UPR and the Marsico Range. The match is a pistol and rifle match. On the UPR steel silhouettes of five upper and lower banks are set up on the bunker rails. Chickens are at 40 meters (m), pigs at 60m, turkeys at 77m and rams at 100m. Both rim fire and centerfire pistols can be shot. On the Marsico Range the silhouette targets are set out to 200 meters with chickens at around 60 meters (m), pigs 100m turkeys 150m and rams at 200m. Big bore revolver pistols are an option from 357 mag to 44 Rem Mg. That match is a good test for big bore pistol shooting. Again check NRA rules or ask our match management team; Dave Willard / Kent Kirkham.

**Air Pistol** both indoor IRB and outdoor at Lower Archery Range (LAR) every Wednesday AM / check calendar for various start times 9am – 10am but ends around noon. Distance is 10 meters and it is an informal shoot. The match is run by Mike Leone and Jeff Little.

**Women's Pistol Shoot** - Diane Farnella has established a special shoot for women. Diane is a certified NRA instructor and is a member of our club. The shoot is on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Friday of the month from 6:00 – 8:00 PM on the Upper Pistol Range (UPR). Please check the calendar! There are some other pistol matches shot on the lower ranges throughout the year. Check the calendar or contact John Tupta.

If pistol shooting interests you, our club meets that quest. In the local shooting communities, we are typically refered as a pistol club. That is not accurate as we shoot all disciplines with passion, but that historical label does fit our club to a large degree.

### **Shooting Tidd Bits**

If you are looking for a good source for ammo, I highly recommend Target Sports and Midsouth. I'm not a big fan of Hornady reloading equipment but I really like their bullets for pistol and rifle reloading. The best periodical for those into shooting sports is **Guns & Ammo**. If you can find older magazines from them from as far back as 2010 and beyond, great read and insight. **CMP – Retail Store is having auctions on an IT system.** Very impressive and surprising items beyond just service rifles. I saw some very nice hunting rifles, Model 70 Winchester etc. However, a lot of Garands! You need to follow their protocol for their retail store qualifications. Our club membership will help. You may need to get a signed membership card ID; your mag key will typically not suffice. Contact Ell Vines if you want to get that ID. **We will be raffling off a special Centennial Winchester Model 94 starting in September.** More info later but tickets will be sold starting in September. The winner will be drawn at the Christmas Party. You will have to be present to win. **Gunsmith** - I have a new gunsmith that I like; **Fayette Gun Shop. The gunsmith is Vincent Capan.** The skill of note is his ability to fine tune triggers. He is a very busy gunsmith. **He is in Fairchance 15436 on 68 East Church Street. His phone number is 724-564-7720.** Fairchance is South and adjacent to Route 43 near Uniontown.

### **Hunting and Fishing in Wilderness Areas of America**

We are under threats from several fronts at both the Federal and State levels. There is a lot of unusual activity on legislation and activity designed by political actions to take away public lands. As usual politicians working with developers and other unsavory individuals and organizations with intent to gain income or other economic advantages by eliminating public use classifications. Backcountry Hunters & Anglers (BHA) have been fending off those threats in the West in Utah and some other states. BHA via their lobbying have been successful. There are at lot of public lands at a federal and state level that are under a constant threat. We have that same problem in Pennsylvania. There are several threats that have been brewing in and around Indiana County and in the NW and North Central (NC) counties. Legislators in these areas are trying to limit the purchase of game lands by the PGC. Game lands only make up 5% of our state. If you would listen to these maverick legislators, you would think game lands covered 50% of our state. These legislators claim the loss off tax income for communities. However, what their interests are is supporting developers to construct housing and other facilities for their private gain. There is little doubt that these developers are also major contributors to these legislator's campaign fund. That is how they manipulate and work the system.

There is even a new threat in NC where several legislators are trying to strip \$ from game funds. Allegedly trying to provide additional tax income for their constituents. **Just because those communities are in "God's Country of Pennsylvania" with vast wilderness for hunting and fishing with limited development.** These politicians and entrepreneurs feel they entitled to strip money from our hunting / game funds to supplement taxes.

Some state politicians see the PGC's strong position with financial assets that they want to exploit for their private interests and gain. The independent status of these two state agencies, PGC (Pennsylvania Game Commission) and PB&FC (Pennsylvania Fish & Boat Commission), is significant in thwarting political abuse and mismanagement via politics. That is why Pennsylvania is still one of if not the best states for hunting and fishing. There is the constant political pressure by several organizations, some very local, that are trying to convert these two great agencies into political agencies. These two independent agencies are science managed and orientated. So, when you see these constant streams of legislation on "opening day deer season – Monday vs Saturday", "antler restriction waiver for seniors" and others; it is all designed to peck away at the agencies independent status by forcing legislation that undermines these agencies. If the PGC would ever be converted to a political agency our game lands would disappear. Pennsylvania's game lands are the

jewels that make our state a great hunting and fishing state. Despite the vast wilderness areas that exist in Alaska, Wyoming, Montana and some other states! So, the lobbying by BHA at both the federal and state levels is a good thing for Pennsylvania.

### **Veterans and Our Country's History**

As I am thinking and writing I'm appreciative to those Veterans from D-Day. This June 6 was their 81<sup>st</sup> anniversary. That was an enormous commitment of blood and life left by them on the beaches of Normandy. That commitment was for the security of America in concert with our allies and friends in Europe. Eventually leading to the establishment of NATO at the end of the war. Eventually incorporating Germany who in 1944 was our enemy but now our ally. NATO is a significant element in the security and defense of our country. It is clearly a defensive organization. Please see the attached video.

We have two great State House Representatives, Natalie Mihalek and Tim O'Neal that cover our region and who are members of our club. Both are Veterans and provide advocacy support for VA claims via the American Legion. Pat Keally originally provided me with the advice to use Natalie / American Legion. Natlie's office is in USC off Boyce Road. Her office number is 724-942-2025. Tim's office number is 724-223-4541 in Washington on North Main Street. Camera Bartolotta, our local State Senator is always working to help Veterans. See a current news item where she has sponsored a bill to help Veterans with an interest in starting a business. Camera is also a member of our club. Her office is in Washington and adjacent West of the Court House on Beau Street in the same building as the Washington VA clinic. This is the new sign on the first set of interior doors for access to Membership Hall (MH). These doors



# **AMERICA'S RIFLE CHALLENGE (ARC)**

ARC can be summarized by three words: **Exciting – Challenging – Fun!** So, what is it really?

**Exciting:** ARC is an action rifle & pistol program based upon defensive shooting skills using modern day firearms. Having a competition like format, events span entry level thru advanced, youth to adults, male and female. Stages incorporate the four basic shooting positions, multiple targets (paper, steel, and motion), barricade use, and multiple reloads.

Challenging: Events go beyond the typical target practice. The program is designed under NRA guidelines to ensure a safe yet challenging experience.

Clinics: entry level stages under the direction of NRA Certified Instructors and Range Safety Officers. Advanced Rifle: more rounds, more skills, more action. ARC Plus: The "plus" adds a pistol to the challenge and don't forget — we added a PCC category at the Pistoleer matches. Events incorporate the same skill sets and stages but involve matches using only the pistol or a pistol along with the rifle (2-Gun). We also will be bringing back the 22LR Special in October.

**Fun:** this program has a ton! Sending rounds down range is great, but ARC takes it to a whole new level!

Each month starting with February, the monthly online newsletter will have more detailed info regarding any upcoming events. By looking in the online newsletter section from 2024, you will get a better feel for what the program entails as well as noting the increasing number of individuals who have already caught on to the American Rifle Challenge!

# **ARC Plus Pistoleer/PCC Match**

As part of the America's Rifle Challenge Program, DMSC will conduct the <u>second</u> Pistoleer Match for 2025 with an added PCC category. Pistoleer Match?? <u>Just what is a Pistoleer Match?</u> If you have been shooting down on the lower ranges, then you are a "Pistoleer" and this <u>unique</u> match may be something of interest to you. <u>PCC = Pistol Caliber Carbine</u>: <u>A firearm of carbine length chambered in a pistol caliber.</u> Participants will compete in seven stages firing at paper, steel, and motion targets. This is an action pistol/PCC match and the course of fire entails modern day defensive shooting skills involving distances from 5 to 30 feet, multiple targets, barricades, several reloads, *and a whole lot of fun*.

**Date:** Saturday, August 9, 2025 **Time:** 8 AM **Cost:** \$5 for DMLSC members; \$10 for non-members.

#### Pistoleer Course of Fire: Total rounds - 80

<u>Stage 1: 5+ feet</u>. Fire four shots from the kneeling position and twelve shots from the standing position using four different target stands, three reloads and the use of a barricade.

<u>Stage 6:</u> 30+ feet. Fire nine shots at three stationary targets while avoiding a double swinger action target containing two No - Shoot targets.

\*\* Note: These are 2 of 7 stages. The actual stages are more robust than this brief description. After signing up for the match, a full detailed description will be sent along with other important information. \*\*

#### Firearm Categories:

**Iron Sights**: a pistol that has only iron sights

**Optics**: a pistol that has only an optic, such as a Red Dot, laser, etc.

**Pistol Types:** semi-automatic

- While there are no pre-requisites, this match will not involve any instruction and participants should possess safe pistol handling skills.
- All PCC participants must have previous experience with any ARC rifle competitions. Acceptable calibers: 9mm, 10mm, .40, .45.
- A pistol with a brace does not qualify as a PCC.
- All NRA Safety Rules and DMLSC Rules apply.
- Competitors need to attend a mandatory safety briefing conducted at the clubhouse.
- Keep all pistols cased and in your vehicles until instructed to bring them to the lower ranges.
- Eye/Ear Protection is mandatory.
- Calibers from 9 mm through 45LC are allowed, but no magnums. <u>All pistols must be securely carried in an exterior holster and Carbines must make use of a sling.</u>
- The match will be conducted as an individual utilizing a shot timer. Scoring will be a combination of speed and accuracy. All stages will begin from the low-ready position.
- Competitors should have a minimum of 3 magazines for the semi-automatic pistols or PCC, and will need to carry them on the person for each live fire stage.
- No incendiary ammunition. All stages utilizing steel targets <u>Lead core ammunition only</u>, no armor piercing (AP), no solid or partial core ammunition containing steel or any metal other than lead.


