This is your *Christmas Party Set Up Crew for 2023*; see page 4. Seventeen members and 34 hands all excited with the Christmas Spirit making their annual contribution to the membership for our Christmas party. Points at and North of Yellowstone country or "close there to" are the best and prime water! Typically, the best time is after the June snow melt, hence July. The airport of choice should be Bozeman. The best car rental agent is National / Enterprise, avoid all the others. Your car rental will be a significant expense, so you need the best agent. Best river, my opinion from 20 + years of experience, is the upper Madison. You don't need a guide or a float trip to have success. All those are avoidable expenses. If you can catch a trout on a fly in Pennsylvania, you can have the same success in Montana / Wyoming. You must fish hard and smart, but you don't need to be an expert to catch quality trout. Future Reloading Training Program - 38 Special



I need to discuss this program with Bruce Ungar and some others. However, my thought is to focus on the 38 Special round / cartridge. The straight wall cartridges are commonly used at the club in target shooting. One of the first steps in reloading is cleaning your brass before resizing. Just my opinion is use corn cobb media and time. A good reference to



know that your brass is clean is the condition of the primer pocket and interior floor of the case. Note that on these pics! More later but the plan is to get it done in 2024. There are a lot of members with more expertise on this program than me. My plan is to incorporate them!

Firearm "Tid Bit"

Tony Molinaro, gunsmith / passed member, taught me how to remove micro rust and other related foreign material from firearm blued finishes. Use #0000 (4) steel wool with a good gun oil! Go slow to start and take your time! Do not try to use other abrasive materials.

Closing - Have a Happy and Holy New Year





AMERICA'S RIFLE CHALLENGE (ARC)

ARC can be summarized by three words: **Exciting – Challenging – Fun!** So, what is it really?

<u>using modern day firearms.</u> Having a competition like format, events span entry level thru advanced, youth to adults, male and female. Stages incorporate the four basic shooting positions, multiple targets (paper, steel, and motion), barricade use, and multiple reloads.

<u>Challenging: Events go beyond the typical target practice.</u> The program is designed under NRA guidelines to insure a safe yet challenging experience.

<u>Clinics:</u> entry level stages under the direction of NRA Certified Instructors and Range Safety Officers. New for 2024 will be a Clinic - Introduction to Practical Pistol Shooting. <u>Advanced Rifle:</u> more rounds, more skills, more action.

<u>ARC Plus:</u> The "plus" adds a pistol to the challenge and <u>don't forget</u> – <u>we added a PCC</u> <u>category at the Pistoleer matches</u>. Events incorporate the same skill sets and stages but involve matches using only the pistol or a pistol along with the rifle (2-Gun).

<u>Fun: this program has a ton!</u> Sending rounds down range is great, but ARC takes it to a whole new level!

INTRODUCTION TO PRACTICAL PISTOL SHOOTING

The America's Rifle Challenge (ARC Plus) program here at DMSC will conduct an inaugural Clinic - *Introduction to Practical Pistol Shooting*.

This clinic offered for the first time ever will provide the new or less experienced pistol owner with an opportunity to learn how to safely use their pistol, learn basic shooting skills, and be introduced to other programs that are available at DMSC and other nearby clubs.

Date: Saturday, April 13, 2024 **Time:** 8:00AM, 9:30AM, and 11:00AM

COST: Members/Candidates \$5; non-Members \$10

The clinic will begin at the indoor range with a rolling registration at 8:00AM, 9:30AM, and 11:00AM. While indoors, all participants will receive instruction on safe handling of their pistol, basic shooting skills, and dry/live firing activities. Additional opportunities will then be offered at an outdoor range - weather permitting. NRA Certified Range Safety Officers will be present for all phases of the clinic. Each participant will receive individual attention to make this a more meaningful experience.

- All NRA Safety Rules and DMLSC Rules apply.
- Eye/Ear Protection and Empty Chamber Indicators are mandatory (ECI's will be provided).
- Participants should have a minimum of 2 magazines and some type of case or optional holster.
- 9mm or higher caliber is preferred. Use of a 22LR pistol will negate the dry firing portion of the clinic.
- Participants must provide their own pistol and ammunition (approximately 50-100 rounds)

ALWAYS keep firearms unloaded until ready to use. **ALWAYS** unload, remove the magazine, and open the action of a firearm when someone is going down range.

<u>NEVER</u> handle firearms while someone is down range. <u>ALWAYS</u> wear proper eye and ear protection at the range.

DMSC Conducts Safety Reviews

Range Safety Officers (RSOs) will conduct random membership checks and safety reviews. RSOs will meet with members and guests while at the firing range. Membership ID's will be checked, and a copy of the range rules will be made available. It is important for all members to review safe gun handling procedures and to focus on the safety rules for each range used. The RSOs will be a wearing a distinctive safety vest or hat and will only ask for a few minutes of your time. Guests and Visitors are subject to the same rules as members. Violators will be subject to disciplinary action up to and including dismissal from club grounds and termination of membership.
